








"...There are fewer job opportunities and the uncertainty of a new contract in 2021..."




Sole parents, people living alone, and other parents with non-adult children were most impacted.



Remote learning support No school aged children 0-5 6-10 10-20 Over 20


For every additional 5 hours supporting remote learning, 0.23 fewer research outputs were produced.



Low sample size restrained analyses for gender diverse people.

"Home-schooling primary aged children was the most difficult thing to manage on top of everything else."

Men and women did not differ statistically in additional teaching hours, employment change or number of hours supporting remote learning (not shown).

On average, teaching professionals spent an additional 96 hours teaching in 2020. This was highest for people in later career stages.

Positive outcomes from COVID-19 included:

- reduced travel to conferences (45 %)
- increased time with household members (53 %)
